As you are aware, the appointment of IPS Officers in Central Armed Police Forces and Central Police Organizations is made as per the provisions contained in the IPS Tenure Policy dated 30.03.2010. Para 13.2 of IPS Tenure Policy stipulates that on completion of approved tenure, the Head of the Organization will be responsible for relieving the officer. No officer will be retained in the Organization beyond the approved tenure. Even in a case where a request has been made for extension of tenure, the officer will get relieved automatically if no approval of the competent authority is received by the stipulated date.

2. It has been noticed that above guidelines are not being adhered to strictly. There have been instances of overstay by Indian Police Service officers on central deputation. This Ministry has taken a serious view of such instances. Against this background the heads of Central Armed Police Forces and other Police organizations are advised to follow the following instructions/ guidelines strictly :-

- (i) The deputation tenure shall be valid only for the period for which it is approved by the Central Government. All the orders shall indicate the period in the body of the order itself. Based on the joining report, a specific order indicating the last date of deputation would also be issued by the Department / Organization.
- (ii) The copy of all deputation orders must be marked to serve on the officer concerned along with State Governments and others concerned.
- (iii) Any extension in deputation period shall neither be automatic nor should be presumed merely on the ground that the organization concerned or the officer or both had made a request to the Central Government for extension. In case, no specific approval of the Central Government for extension is received within the period for which deputation was originally valid, the officer shall have to be relieved on completion of the original tenure.
- (iv) An officer immediately after expiry of approved deputation period shall have to relinquish charge and shall get himself / herself relieved without waiting for formal rejection on his request for extension from the Central Government.



(v) Any Over-stay beyond the approved period of deputation without prior approval of the Government of India shall lead to an adverse impact on the prospects of the officer at the time of the empanelment and could also lead to disciplinary proceedings against the officer himself / herself, as well as the Head of the Organization.

3. You are advised to take note of the above, for strict compliance, without any exception whatsoever.
